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# Communication is the key to student success

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## TITLE I PROGRAM

- The Title I schoolwide program is designed to meet the specific needs of students from low income families or those attending a school that is predominantly low-income. Title I programs are designed to improve the educational opportunities of children and help them:
- Succeed in the regular program
- Attain grade level proficiency
- Improve achievement in basic and advanced skills



## THE LAW

The 2001 reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, PL 107-110, generally known as No Child Left Behind requires that:

- School districts have a written policy regarding parental involvement
- Parents be involved in the development, operation, and evaluation of the Title I program
- Parents be informed about the qualifications of their children's teachers, and that all of a school's teachers be highly qualified

## GOALS OF TITLE I PARENT INVOLVEMENT

1. Inform parents of the specific instructional objectives and methods of the program
2. Support the efforts of parents to work with their children in the home to attain the instructional objectives of the program
3. Train teachers, administrators, and other staff to work effectively with parents
4. Consult with parents concerning the manner in which the school and parents can work together to achieve instructional objectives
5. Provide a comprehensive range of opportunities for parents to be informed and involved in the design and evaluation of the program

6. Ensure opportunities for participation of parents who lack literacy or who's native language is not English

## PARENTS' RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Parents have the right to a copy of the law and an explanation of the policy. Parents also have the right to contribute their input into the development of the Title I program, its implementation and evaluation, and to have activities that are specifically designed to help them help their children improve their academic performance. Parents also have a right to information regarding the qualification of their child's teachers.

In order to be informed and participate, parents should attend Title I parent involvement meetings, parent-teacher conferences, and other activities offered at the school. Parents should also be prepared to be real participants in their children's education, which may mean making sacrifices. The reward will be more than worth the effort — sharing in the preparation of your child for a good and fulfilling future.
